William Penn Trail Update

- 1. William Penn was born on October 24, 1644.
- 2. He was born in London, England.
- 3. Two relatives, whose paintings used to hang in the museum, are Hannah Callowhill Penn (his second wife) and Admiral Sir William Penn (his father).
- 4. The first purchase of land made by Penn from the Delaware Indians was July 15, 1682. (Southern Bucks County including Pennsbury)
- 5. King Charles II's Coat of Arms is sometimes displayed in the museum.

In doing the hike the following things need to be observed:

There is no sign on the icehouse door (second of the four small buildings).

You will have to go around the hedge in the back court (behind the Manor House, near the stable).
