

PACK TRAINER

Your goal as Pack trainer is to have 100% of your pack leadership fully trained (per BSA) in their specific position thus fulfilling the training requirement for Quality Unit. You are a registered member of the Pack Committee.

1. Conduct the orientation of new families and Pack leaders (Fast Start)
2. Ensure Youth Protection training is given in your Pack each year, targeting the new leaders and parents (current BSA policy is each leader should retake this training every 2 years)
3. Conduct and assist other training sessions as needed by the district and/or council training committees
4. Encourage pack leaders to attend ongoing training (lifelong learning) such as roundtable, Pow Wow, University of Scouting, outdoor training, Wood Badge
5. Remain current with training material and program updates (this information is provided by the District Training Chairman)
6. Keep track of pack training records, and give updates of trainings attended to the District Training Chairman.
7. Communicate training needs to the District Training Chairman or Council Training Chairman.

This training provides the skills and techniques necessary for trainers to train with the latest techniques with BSA aims and methods.
